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#### **About Abortion Care**

#### Abortion Pill/Medication Abortion (up to 11 weeks):

- Terminating a pregnancy by taking a combination of two different medications: Mifepristone + Misoprostol. You can also use Misoprostol alone to have an abortion.
- Mifespristone blocks your body's own progesterone, stopping the pregnancy from growing.
- Misoprostol causes cramping and bleeding to empty your uterus. Taking this medication is similar to having a really heavy, crampy period and the process is very similar to a miscarriage.
- The abortion pill is very effective. If you're taking Mifepristone + Misoprostol, efficacy depends on how far along the pregnancy is and how many doses of medicine you take.
  - At 8 weeks pregnant or less, it works about 94-98% of the time
  - At 8-9 weeks pregnant, it works about 94-96% of the time
  - O At 9-10 weeks pregnant, it works about 91-93% of the time
    - If you take an extra dose of misoprostol, it works about 99% of the time
  - O At 10-11 weeks pregnant, it works about 87% of the time.
    - If you take an extra dose of misoprostol, it works about 98% of the time
  - In general, taking both mifepristone and misoprostol works better than taking misoprostol only. Taking misoprostol alone works to end the pregnant about 85-95% of the time.
- It's important to follow-up after your procedure to confirm a complete abortion.

#### Procedural/In-Clinic Abortion:

- Terminating a pregnancy by using suction to take a pregnancy out of your uterus.
- There are two types of in-clinic abortion procedures.
  - Suction Abortion (vacuum aspiration) is the most common type of procedure that uses gentle suction to empty your uterus. It's usually used until about 14-16 weeks after your last period.
  - Dilation & Evacuation (D&E) uses suction and medical tools to empty your uterus. It's usually used if it has been 16 weeks or longer since your last period.
- In-clinic abortions are very safe and effective. They work more than 99% of the time and needing to repeat the procedure because the abortion didn't work is rare.
- There is typically no follow-up required after a procedural abortion.
